



New green opened in Port Bouvard

A NEW synthetic green was officially opened by Dawesville MLA Kim Hames and Mandurah City Mayor Paddi Creevey at the Port Bouvard Recreation and Sporting Club last Friday afternoon.

With the club's membership booming from 342 to more than 1300 over the past five years, the third synthetic green was installed to meet the needs of bowling numbers.

The \$1.3million project, which took two years to complete, was funded by the Sport and Recreation Department and City of Mandurah.

Further works such as fencing, reticulation and sun protection was installed at cost and a volunteer effort from club members.

Bowlers christened the new green with a 'spider' where all bowlers put down one bowl at a central target. Later this year the club will celebrate its 30th anniversary. The club offers a diverse range of activities including lawn bowls, croquet, tennis, sailing, angling arts and crafts, keep fit classes, bootscooting, a quilting group, mahjong, darts, carpet bowls and it is also the home of the Dawesville RSL.
